Henry H. (Hank) Clough

1923—2011

Henry H. Clough, a member of the Chapter since 2006, passed away on January 8, 2011 at age 88. Known as Hank, he had been an insurance agent during his career and had only recently acquired his 1957 Hudson Hornet. In his New Member profile, he remembered the Hudsons and Terraplanes that his father owned and his own projects and antique cars. Hank always had a love of old cars and was searching for a 1954 Nash when he found his Hudson.

In 2006, at age 83, he purchased the car in Iowa and then drove it home alone. Quite an impressive feat!

Hank was a resident of Sandy Spring, MD and is survived by 3 children and 2 grandchildren. The memorial service was held on January 14th in Rockville, MD. The CBC sends condolences to the family and mourns the passing of yet another CBC member.



Joel B. Horne

1934-2011

Joel B. Horne, a CBC member since 1992, died unexpectedly on January 14, 2011 at the age of 76. He had been successfully recovering from a broken hip.

Joel grew up in Roanoke and Charlottesville, Virginia. His love of classic American automobiles came naturally, as his father had been a Packard dealer and Joel was surrounded by new and used cars as a youngster. His first car was a '33 Chevy but his first "real" car (in his own words) was a 1947 Commodore Eight, and he followed this up with two more Hudsons before shifting to Brand X's as everyday cars from that point on. His first job, in 1952, was in the parts department of Potomac Motors, a Hudson dealer in Washington. This was interrupted by a hitch with the U.S. Army, and when he returned to civilian life in 1955 he went to work for Old Dominion Motors, a large Rambler (and former Hudson) dealership in Alexandria, Va. Later he worked as a parts manager for a Chrysler dealership in Herndon, Va., and finally he established Horne's Auto Repair on his farm outside Waterford, Virginia.

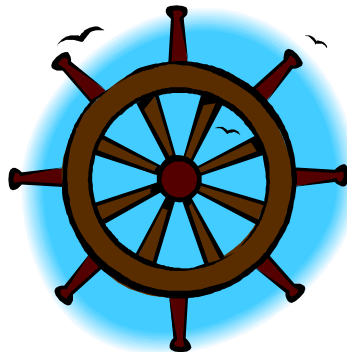

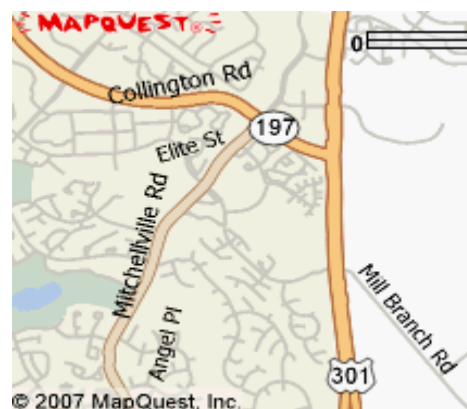

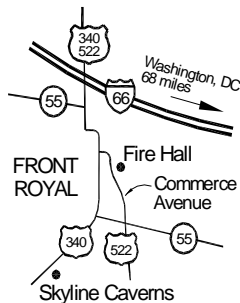

Although he loved many makes of antique cars -- especially Packards, Chryslers, Studebakers and Buicks --, Joel's "Hudson roots" beckoned to him in May of 1990, when he saw a dazzling array of Hudsons displayed at the Apple Blossom antique car show in Winchester, Virginia. In 1991 he bought a 1953 Hornet sedan in Nashville, Tennessee, and drove it home -- his first Hudson in decades. The following year he joined the CBC, and over the succeeding years he was responsible for keeping many CBC members' Hudsons on the road.

Joel was always up for a "road trip". He took many of them -- local and long distance -- in the process of buying and selling antique cars and parts and seeking out museums and car shows. As the years passed his garage became a mecca for old car enthusiasts, and his barn a repository of tons of parts both new and used for automobiles both obscure and commonplace. As he aged, Joel's energy hardly diminished. In recent years he built a large metal garage, learned how to use the internet to sell parts, and continued his far-flung road trips.

Joel is survived by Mary, his wife of 54 years, their son J. Blair Horne Jr. and daughters Diana Faith Horne Cox and Holly Horne Poole, his brother Bruce R. Horne of Florida; and four grandchildren.

A memorial service was held Jan. 18 at Catocin Presbyterian Church in Waterford. Donations in Joel's name may be made to Lovettsville Fire and Rescue, PO Box 209, Lovettsville, VA 20180.

Owned by Paul Rose, this shop offers complete and partial restorations of antique, classic and special interest automobiles and virtually whatever other auto related service the customer needs.. Members attending were from the CBC, Tri State Mt. Roads chapters and one hardy individual even trekked down from PA Dutch country. And as we requested, two of the members brought friends.

While waiting for everyone to arrive, Paul offered a tour of the facility. In Process were a 16 cylinder Marmon, a 33 Cadillac, cars of the 50's and muscle cars of various vintages. The 23 Buick Convertible we saw is owned by Paul who has decided that it will not be restored but will wear the signs of its age proudly.

We completed the tour, seeing various cars including a 67 Sunbeam Tiger and a 59 Facel Vega . The 29 Hudson's Chassis was in one section of the shop., it's body being worked on in another.

As the tour proceeded, we picked up interesting bits and pieces regarding the cars. Some facts known, oth-

ers new. Example: Marmon began manufacturing farm equipment and developed the 16 cylinder engine before the car was designed, instead of following the more usual path, of designing the car, then the engine. Cars were guaranteed to be able to do 100 miles per hour. Who knew? Some of us, obviously.

Settling down in the break room, we dined on pizza and salad and all sorts of side dishes. Our host supplied the pizza and members brought the sides and cookies and other staples of life.

During lunch, Jon Battle showed a tape he made about 20 years ago at various meets and members enjoyed trying to remember names and seeing themselves much younger

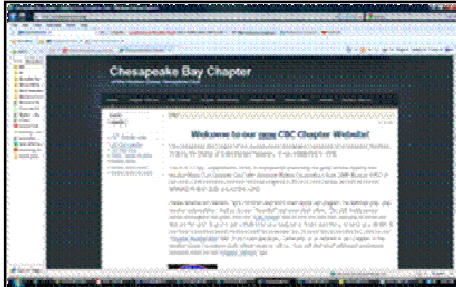
