On Saturday, February 4th, several CBC and Mt. Roads Chapter members and friends made their way to Inwood, WV for a most enjoyable afternoon at Vintage Motorcar Co., LLC.

Numerous cars in various states of restoration aptly demonstrated the meticulous care and attention to detail of this restoration shop. The vehicles ranged from muscle cars to the stunning 1932 V-16 Marmon, 1933 Cadillac V-8 and 1937 Packard 120C Convertible among others.

Paul Rose, one of the proprietors, gave us a tour, which raised questions as we went along. 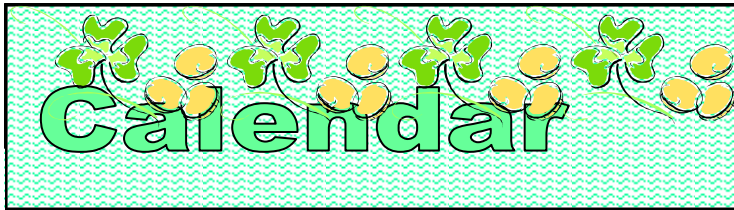

If one Essex is good, two are better! **Timothy Thompson** has a couple of Essex rarities: a '31 2-door sedan and a '32 five-window coupe. And if he gets tired of those, he has 20 other collector cars to keep him busy!

Tim started fooling around with automobiles when he was a thirteen year-old growing up in Hagerstown, Maryland. His first car was a '57 Chevy Bel Air four-door sedan which he bought for \$300 at the age of sixteen. When he graduated from high school he purchased a '70 Chevelle SS. Unlike other young guys he didn't sell one car to finance the next; he kept them all and bought more! As the collection grew, he needed storage space, so he'd buy a house, rent it out, and use the backyard to build a garage for one or two more of his cars. Eventually he ended up with 22 antique cars, several houses, a nice income from rent, and plenty of storage space! Tim found the '32 Essex quite by accident ten years ago. He'd journeyed to Hershey to seek a windshield latch for the '31, when he spotted the '32 in the Car Corral and fell in love with it. He likes this car a lot and drives it as much or more than any other car in his collection.

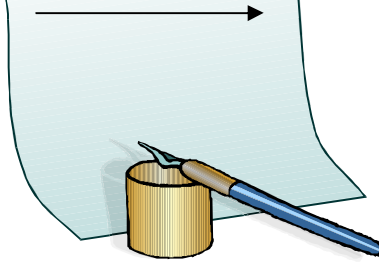

Of Interest to the Hobbyist

Bill HR 550, providing for changes to the current antique vehicle license plate laws, has been introduced into the Md. House of Delegates,

The stated purpose of the bill is (in its sponsors' words) "Increasing to 25 years the age that a motor vehicle must attain before it may be registered as a historic motor vehicle; prohibiting a specified historic motor vehicle from being used for specified purposes; requiring an applicant for registration of a historic motor vehicle to submit with the application a certification that the vehicle is insured by a specified vehicle insurance policy; etc."

The exact wording of the bill, and its progress through the House, can be found on the internet; simply type HB550 Md into your browser and choose the BILL INFO link.

Essentially, the bill would increase to 25 years the age at which a car can get historic license plates (it now stands at 20 years) and would require proof that the car is insured, and remove the "occasional transportation" from the permissible uses of the historic car. (Cars with antique plates are traditionally permitted to be driven only to car shows, in parades, to repair shops or "occasionally" to the Taste Freeze; apparently ice cream cones are no longer included in permissible behavior.)

HR 550 has gone through its "first reading". (The first reading is when a bill is introduced and "read across the desk" for the first time and assigned to a standing committee.) A hearing was scheduled in the House Environmental Matters Committee for Feb. 28 at 1:00 P.M.
